

## ADMISSION TO UCC

All Trinitas School of Nursing applicants must be a Union County College(UCC) student. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide the following information and/or credentials to the Union County College Admissions Office to complete his/her application:

- Official high school transcript or GED test scores
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary schools attended

Foreign transcripts may require an evaluation by the World Education Services if the applicant is seeking transfer credit.

# GENERIC RN PROGRAM TRACK

## CURRICULUM DESIGN

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The Trinitas School of Nursing (TSON) and Union County College (UCC) jointly conduct a cooperative nursing program. This program awards a Diploma in Nursing from Trinitas School of Nursing and an Associate in Science Degree from Union County College upon successful completion of the curriculum.

Prospective Trinitas School of Nursing students enter Union County College as a Health Science major and apply for admission into the Trinitas School of Nursing through the NURE 130 admission application process.

Fully accredited by the New Jersey State Board of Nursing and the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, the program offers a basic course of study in nursing. It provides a sound theoretical base of knowledge in nursing, biologic, behavioral, and sociological sciences and integrates this knowledge into academic and practical experiences within the health and illness continuum of patient care. Utilization of a variety of health care agencies facilitates the application of all aspects of the students' learning.

Students earn a total of 75 credits. Upon graduation, students are eligible to sit for the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX-RN) for Registered Nurse Licensure.

**A negative criminal history background check and a negative drug screen are required by the School of Nursing for enrollment into clinical nursing courses starting with NURE 131. A criminal background check is also required upon application for RN Licensure.**

Science and liberal arts courses (general education) may be completed at the Elizabeth, Plainfield, or Cranford campus of Union County College. Nursing (NURE) courses are conducted by Trinitas School of Nursing on the Elizabeth Campus. Students may be granted up to 36 transfer credits from another college toward the Associate Degree.

Day, evening and weekend lecture and clinical sections available for NURE courses.

Curriculum sequence presented below is intended for students planning to study nursing as a full-time student.

Due to the rigorous nature of nursing curriculum courses, it is recommended that if the full-time curriculum sequence is chosen, students limit outside work obligations to support student success in the program.

Prospective students should meet with a Union County College advisor for course planning.

## TSON ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### Admission requirements for enrollment in NURE 130:

- Current enrollment at Union County College.
- Satisfactory completion of developmental courses (if applicable).
- Attendance at a Trinitas School of Nursing Information Session.
- Minimum Union County College or High School GPA of 2.5.
- Cumulative score of 50% or higher on the TEAS admission exam.
- Successful completion or current registration in the NURE 130 co-requisite courses.
- **Please note: Applicants with two previous failures at another nursing program are not eligible for admission consideration.**
