

ADMISSION TO UCC

All Trinitas School of Nursing applicants must be a Union County College (UCC) student. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide the following information and/or credentials to the Union County College Admissions Office to complete his/her application:

- UCC admission application, apply online at www.ucc.edu.
- Official high school transcript or GED test scores
- Official transcripts from all post-secondary schools attended
- Email nursing@ucc.edu to schedule an advisement appointment.

Foreign transcripts may require an evaluation by World Education Services or other authorized services if the application is seeking transfer credit.

GENERIC RN PROGRAM TRACK

The Trinitas School of Nursing (TSON) and Union County College (UCC) jointly conduct a Cooperative Nursing Program. This program awards a Diploma in Nursing from Trinitas School of Nursing and an Associate in Science Degree from Union County College upon successful completion of the curriculum.

Prospective Trinitas School of Nursing students enter Union County College as a Health Science major and apply for admission into the Trinitas School of Nursing through an admission application process.

Fully accredited by the New Jersey State Board of Nursing and the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing, the program offers a basic course of study in nursing. It provides a sound theoretical base of knowledge in nursing, biological, behavioral and sociological sciences, and integrates this knowledge into academic and practical experiences within the health and illness continuum of patient care.

Students earn a total of 73 credits. Upon graduation students are eligible to sit for the National Council Licensing Examination (NCLEX-RN) for Registered Nurse Licensure.

A negative criminal history background check and a negative drug screen are required by the School of Nursing for enrollment into clinical nursing courses starting with NURE 131.

Science and liberal arts courses (general education) may be completed at the Elizabeth, Plainfield, or Cranford campus of Union County College. Nursing (NURE) courses are conducted by Trinitas School of Nursing on the Elizabeth Campus. Students may be granted up to 36 transfer credits from another college toward the Associate Degree, however nursing courses are not transferable. Transfer credit for college courses requires grades of C or better.

CURRICULUM DESIGN

Day, Evening and Weekend clinical sections are available for nursing courses.

Curriculum sequence presented below is intended for students planning to study nursing as a full-time student.

Due to the rigorous nature of nursing curriculum courses, it is recommended that if the full-time curriculum sequence is chosen, students limit outside work obligations to support student success in the program.

Prospective students must meet with a Union County College advisor for course planning

All accepted students are required to attend New Student Orientation scheduled prior to start of classes.

TSON APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Application requirement for enrollment in Generic Track

- Current enrollment at Union County College
- Attendance at Trinitas School of Nursing Information Session within 12 months of application submission
- Minimum Union County College or High School GPA of 2.5
- Transfer students refer to the website for further details
- Cumulative score of 55% or higher on the TEAS admission exam
- Successful completion or current registration in Trinitas co-requisite courses as noted on the website
- Developmental courses may be recommended by academic advising
- **Please note: Applicants with two previous failures at Trinitas or another nursing program are not eligible for admission consideration**
